 my Executors.
 Item I give to my daughter SUSANNA GARIOT and her heirs forever one shilling to be
 paid by my Executors.
 Item I give to my son BENJAMIN SPICER and to his heirs forever that tract or parcel of
 land whereon he now lives being part of the tract of land I now live on to be equally
 divided between the line to run through my plantation taking my lower orchard to him
 his heirs forever.
 Item I give to my son MOSES SPICER after the death of my beloved Wife MARY SPICER
 the land I now live on after Benjamin Spicer has his part before bequeathed to him and
 his heirs forever also I give my son AARON SPICER after the death of my beloved Wife
 Mary Spicer all my movable property consisting of horses, cattle, hogs, sheep and all
 my household furniture to him his heirs forever and I do hereby ordain and appoint
 my sons Moses and Benjamin Spicer my lawfull Executors of this my last Will and
 Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of

August One thousand seven hundred and ninety seven.
